


Carl Linnaeus Award: Ms. Aswathy V Nair was presented with a Cash prize of Rs. 5000 and Certificate of Award.


Prof. M. S. Swaminathan Award: Ms. C. Sowmiya was presented with a Cash Prize of Rs. 4000/- and Certificate of Award.

5. Research Highlights

5.1. Abstract of paper presented for Carl Linnaeus Award [Award winning paper]

Evidence based scientific validation of the Antioxidant potential of *Phyllocephalum* rangacharii(Gamble) Narayana, an ethnomedicinal plant and its quantitative phytochemical evaluation

Phyllocephalum rangacharii (Gamble) Narayana,, an erect, slender herb belongs to the Asteraceae family is medicinally used by Cholanaikkan tribal groups of Kerala to treat skin inflammation and related skin diseases. Traditional medical knowledge can be explored and diverse natural leads may be found and drugs can be prepared with a fusion of ancient wisdom and modern science. Therefore the present study is designed to determine the total phenolic, flavonoid and total tannin content in the ethanolic, hydro ethanolic and aqueous extracts of P. rangacharii as well as the antioxidant potential. Antioxidants can be efficient molecules for treatment as well as prevention of a large number of diseases. The antioxidant activities of extracts were evaluated using different methods such as Total antioxidant activity, Ferric Reducing Antioxidant Potential (FRAP) assay, Reducing power activity and ABTS radical scavenging activity. Hydroethanolic extract possess the highest amount of phenols, flavonoids and tannins when compared to other extracts. The results of antioxidant assays also revealed that the hydroethanolic extract has the significant free radical scavenging and reducing power than the other two extracts. The findings of the present study thus justified its use in the traditional folk medicine. The study gains its importance in the current scenario as the researchers from all over the world are now focussing on alternate sources other than synthetic ones which will be more safe, convenient and economically viable.

5.2. Abstract of paper presented for Prof. M. S. Swaminathan Award [Award winning paper] Abundance, foraging behaviour and efficiency of insect pollinators and their effect on moringa yield

Pollinator's survey was conducted in Oddanchatram block of Dindigul district where drumstick is grown in large scale. A total of 27 species of insect pollinators were observed in drumstick ecosystem. Among them, three belonged to *Apis* Hymenoptera, ten to non *Apis* Hymenoptera, seven to Diptera and seven to Lepidoptera. The foraging behaviour of *A. cerana indica* was the maximum at 0800 to 0900 h, *Amegilla zonata* at 1200 to 1300 h and *Episyrpus* sp. at 0800 to 0900 h. Pollination Efficiency Index was found to be the highest in case of *Xylocopa* sp. (7.7) followed by *A. cerana indica* (5.9), *A. dorsata* (5.7) and *Amegilla zonata* (4.6). Thus the present study indicated that *A. cerana indica* was most abundant pollinator but *Xylocopa* sp. was the most efficient pollinator in drumstick ecosystem. *A. cerana indica*'s working hours were more followed by *Amegilla zonata*, *Polistes* sp., *A. dorsata* and *Xylocopa* sp. In case of handling time, *A. cerana indica* spent more time followed by *A. dorsata*, *Amegilla zonata*, *Xylocopa* sp. while *Polistes* sp. expended lesser time. The yield and yield parameters was high when compared to control. Yield parameters included number of fruits per tree which was ranged from 202 while control has 151 fruits. Also the fruit length, fruit girth, individual fruit weight and fruit yield were varied from control. The colony growth parameters *viz.*, sealed honey area, pollen area, sealed brood area and adult bee population also developed. Therefore by managing Indian honey bee colonies, we can get profit on both moringa and colony yield.


"Distinguished Asian Mycologist Award" to Dr. D.J. Bagyaraj
