3. A decade of NABS - reminiscence

The year 2014 sees a new milestone in the annals of NABS as it is a decade old baby. The humble feeling is that we are fulfilling the dreams of the Founder President who conceived the idea of forming 'National Academy of Biological Sciences' which was founded on 31 December, 2004 by Prof. Dr. S. Kannaiyan, the then Chairman, National Biodiversity Authority, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India., Chennai, Tamil Nadu, with EC members and Headquarter at Chennai. The Executive Council constituted at the time of registration constituted President - Prof. Dr. S. Kannaiyan (Founder President), Vice President-Prof. N. Anand (Founder Vice-President) Secretary-Dr. S. S. Gnanamanickam (Founder Secretary) and Treasurer-Dr. T. L. Baskaran (Founder Treasurer). The founder Executive Council members were Prof. V. Sundararajan, Dr. K. Balaraman and Prof. T. Subramoniam.

The Academy was registered as "National Academy of Biological Sciences" under the Tamil Nadu Societies registration Act 1975 (TN Act 27 of 1975) on 10th March, 2005 at Chennai South, Saidapet, Chennai- 600 015 with Certificate of Registration No. 110 / 2005 with a vision to provide a common platform for the biologists to interact with each other for mutual benefit and to further the knowledge on areas of biological sciences.

In the foundation year 18 members were enrolled as life members including one member from USA. One could visualize the herculean task meted out by the Secretary to enroll more and more members to strengthen the activities of the Academy. Prof. M. S. Swaminathan was the first to be conferred with Honorary Fellow of the Academy. The function was organized at the Guindy campus of University of Madras, Chennai.

Milestones of NABS

2004

- National Academy of Biological Sciences founded by Prof. S. Kannaiyan on 31st December, 2004 became one
 of the full fledged scientific academies in the country.
- Eighteen life members were enrolled during the year including one member from USA.

2005

- Dr. S. Gnanamanickam, Secretary was authorized to register the Academy under Society's Act.
- National Academy of Biological Sciences was registered under TN Societies Registration Act 1975 on 10th March, 2005 having Head Quarters at Chennai.
- Ninety five members enrolled themselves as life members of the Academy.
- Prof. M. S. Swaminathan was the first to be nominated for conferring Honorary Fellow of NABS.
- Thirteen other members were also conferred with Fellow of NABS.

2007

 Election of nineteen members for election year 2007 was approved during the EC meeting held on 4th July 2008 at Loyola College, Chennai.

2008

5th Executive Council Meeting

 The meeting was held on 4th July 2008 at Loyola College, Chennai. Dr. D. Sudarsanam, EC Member and Professor of Loyola College arranged the meeting.

Decisions

- Every year the election of members for fellowship will be made.
- The election of 19 members for the election year 2007 ratified.
- A perfect scoring system need to be developed to evaluate the applications received for fellowship and other awards.
- Another category of Fellowship-Associate Fellowship was introduced. Members who are 40 years of age and below are eligible to apply.
- EC meeting may be organized in various zones of the country to have active participation of all members and make NABS more visible.
- Decided to develop a model website which could be finally launched as NABS website.
- The format of NABS News letter to be standardized and released at regular intervals. Dr. V. A. Parthasarathy will take initiatives.
- The life membership fee is fixed as Rs.1000/- (onetime payment)

6th Executive Council Meeting

 The meeting was held on 29 September 2008 at Silver Jubilee Hall of Indian Institute of Spices Research, Calicut, Kerala. Prof. S. Kannaiyan, President, NABS presided.

- Honorary Membership of NABS: NAAS Fellows or any biological scientist of high repute may be considered for admitting as a Honorary Member of NABS without paying the prescribed fee.
- Starting a Journal: It was decided to start a journal by name "Biological Sciences". A committee under the
 chairmanship of Dr. V. A. Parthasarathy with Dr. M. Anandaraj and Dr. T. Marimuthu as members was constituted to
 work out the modalities.
- Introduction of new Awards: New awards will be introduced in the name of eminent scientists of the country to recognize their contributions to biological sciences.
- NABS Academic / Scientific Leadership Award to be introduced.
- NABS-Woman Scientist Award to be introduced.
- Organizing Interactive Workshops on selected themes at regular intervals.
- Organizing seminar-thematic seminar utilizing the visits of eminent scientists to Chennai could be organized.
- Organizing critical environmental campaigns for the benefit of school and college students.
- Science popularization awareness meetings for the benefit of school and college students.
- Publication of technical bulletins by NABS on specific technology identified by EC.
- Seeking funds from ICAR/DST/DBT/MoE as matching grant.
- The present LOGO of NABS has been revised and the same is accepted and to be registered.
